Activity: Build a boat out of cushions, blankets, anything you can find. Make sure the boat is big enough that you and anyone in your household who is participating can sit in it! Get in the boat together before you start the video! Extra challenge – If you make your boat outside....you could have a sprinkler ready to turn on during the devotion! Make sure the computer doesn't get wet!

Younger Track (Preschool-Grade 1)-

- Questions-
 1. Who is someone you could share "Jesus loves you" with today? Have a grown up help you do it!
 2. Tell those in the boat with you about a time in your life that was scary.
 3. Ask your grown up this question – how could knowing Jesus give me power and hope in a scary time?

Older Track (Grades 2-6)-

- Questions-
 1. If you could tell a person who didn't know Jesus something about Jesus what would you say? Who could you tell?
 2. Tell those in the boat with you about a time in your life that was scary and you felt powerless.
 3. Next time you feel powerless, how could knowing Jesus give you hope or make a difference?

Day 2: Print Making

Supplies included in your kit:

- Blank paper and sample drawings
- Ball point pen (red)
- Styrofoam “plates” (3.5” x 6” rectangle)
- Washable markers
- Card Stock notecards
- Envelopes

Supplies not included:

- Damp sponge or damp paper towel
- Tape

What to do:

1. Draw a simple picture that fits inside the the blank paper provided or choose one of the samples provided.
2. Line up a sheet of Styrofoam with the rectangle that frames your picture (the Styrofoam should be under the paper) and tape it in place.
3. Use the ballpoint pen to trace the picture, making sure you apply enough pressure to imprint the Styrofoam, but not so much that you tear the paper.
4. Check to see that you have traced your whole picture before you remove the tape. The imprinted Styrofoam is your re-usable printing plate.
5. Now, use the ballpoint pen to re-trace the image on the Styrofoam (without the paper this time) to make sure it is well imprinted. A parent may want to do this for the youngest children.
6. Using washable markers, color the whole surface of the Styrofoam printing plate.
7. Working quickly so things remain damp, lightly moisten the Notecard with a damp sponge or paper towel. It should be damp but not dripping wet. Then carefully lay the Notecard on top of the colored printing plate. You can tape it in place to help keep the image from shifting.
8. Use the heel of your hand to rub the whole surface of the Notecard. This will transfer the washable marker from the plate to the Notecard, so make sure you rub the whole surface well. (Tape will help keep things from shifting around as you do this).
9. Carefully lift the Notecard and allow it to dry.
10. Write a message on the back of your Notecard and send it to someone who could use an uplifting message. We have provided names and addresses of Redeemer members who are shut-ins, but you may know others who would like to receive your beautiful artwork.
11. Your printing plates are completely reusable! Simply wipe off any leftover marker, then you can color the plate again and stamp away! Think how many people can be cheered by your colorful handmade cards!
