SCRIPTURE READING

L: The Old Testaments Reading for Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost is from Psalm 84.

¹ How lovely is your dwelling place, LORD Almighty! ² My soul yearns, even faints, for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God. ³ Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may have her young—a place near your altar, LORD Almighty, my King and my God. ⁴ Blessed are those who dwell in your house; they are ever praising you.

⁵ Blessed are those whose strength is in you, whose hearts are set on pilgrimage. ⁶ As they pass through the Valley of Baka, they make it a place of springs; the autumn rains also cover it with pools. ⁷ They go from strength to strength, till each appears

before God in Zion.

⁸ Hear my prayer, LORD God Almighty; listen to me, God of Jacob. ⁹ Look on our shield, O God; look with favor on your anointed one.

Health Notes

Are you experiencing more skin irritation lately? Especially on your nose, cheeks, and hands? Blame the pandemic! Skin can become irritated with repeated mask and glove use, and frequent handwashing. We must continue to wear masks (and gloves, when necessary) and wash our hands to keep ourselves and those around us healthy. However, there are a few minor changes that you can make to your routine to promote healthier skin.



Dry, chapped, or irritated hands:

- Use fragrance-free, mild soaps and lotions
- Apply hand cream/lotion generously after washing hands, when the skin is still damp
- Wear gloves when washing dishes, bathing children, cleaning surfaces, etc.
- Use a humidifier in your home to keep the air moist (especially as we enter the colder months!)
- Pat your hands dry instead of wiping them

Irritated ears, cheeks, or bridge of nose:

- Make sure your mask fits your face well (not too tight, not too loose)
- Take a “mask break” when safe and appropriate (for example, for 15 minutes every 2 hours)
- If your ears are sore, consider using masks that have ties that do not rest on your ears or use a band that brings the mask ear loops behind your head and off your ears.

This is not an easy time for anyone! It may be difficult to see the benefit of protective measures such as masks and gloves when they are inconvenient and cause skin irritation. Let others see us “clothe ourselves with compassion” (Colossians 3:12) and protect others by limiting the spread of germs during this pandemic. We can all look forward to the day that we can see each other’s smiles again!
